Volunteers needed



Project: How resistant Turbo chooks are on Maria Island?

I am looking at the impact of environmental changes and ecological interactions (competition and predation) on the Tasmanian native-hen's reproduction on Maria Island.

When: 2-5 days per week, every week from late August 2018 to March 2019

Where: Maria Island (2 km² around Darlington)

Fieldwork: Territories' monitoring (observations) to measure native-hens' reproduction and survival. We will generally stay 2 days per week, but can be extended to 4-5 days in case of nesting. Good sense of observation is required.

Volunteers will need to bring their own camping gear. Food, campsite, transport from Hobart and ferry will be covered.
